



## Painting Instructions for 4083 Garden Tablet

### Kimble Colors Needed:

750 Bisque Primer, 717 Mushroom, 760 Antique Media, 711 Sapphire, 713 Primrose, 715 Burgundy, 704 Taupe, 707 Evergreen, 710 Sunshine, 702 Walnut, 712 Amethyst, 709 Topaz, 761 Perfect Matte Spray, 972 Silver, 900 White, 902 Black

### Kimble It Brushes, Soft Paper Towel

Use a large soft brush, to thoroughly basecoat the entire piece with 750 Bisque Primer. After basecoat is dry, apply 717 mushroom to the entire piece in small sections and wipe the product back with a soft paper towel. Pat the product back to desired intensity using a soft paper towel moistened with 760 Antique Media. Apply a small amount of 711 Sapphire to the end of a natural hair filbert brush (Kimble It Brush) and begin applying the product to the top sky area of the scene. A little of the color will go a long way. You can wipe the color back and move it further by using a clean filbert brush and brushing over the area to move the color or by patting the color with a clean soft paper towel. Use the same methods to apply 713 Primrose to the bottom portion of the sky area in the scene. Blend the two areas together with a brush. Use a Q-Tip and Antique Media to wipe the fence back to white, leaving some product in the low detailed areas. Use a small natural hair filbert brush to apply a mixture of 715 Burgundy and 704 Taupe to the pots in the scene. Pat back with a clean brush. Use a small filbert to apply 707 Evergreen to the grass, stems and leaves in the scene. Pat back the 707 Evergreen with a clean brush. Highlight the grass by applying a tiny bit of 710 Sunshine to a natural hair filbert brush, wiping the product into the brush on a paper towel and then "drybrushing" the grass with the brush. Use this same drybrushing technique to apply 709 Topaz to the wood of the birdhouse. Use small natural hair filbert brushes to apply the following colors to the following areas: 715 Burgundy – birdhouse roof, 712 Amethyst – hollyhocks, 713 Primrose -daisy petals, 710 Sunshine – daisy centers, 702 Walnut – dirt in pot. Use a clean brush to wipe the colors back to highlight raised areas. Apply 972 Silver to watering can. Paint the checkers on the birdhouse 902 Black and 900 White. Paint the birdhouse hole 902 Black. Allow the product to dry several hours and spray the entire piece with 761 Perfect Matte Spray. Allow the spray to dry for several hours and paint the "welcome" lettering with 902 Walnut.
