Painting Instructions for 4086 / 4081 Butterfly
Flameless Burner, lid and base

Colors Needed:

Mayco EL 119 Burnished Steel

Kimble Colors: 750 Bisque Primer, 710 Sapphire,
700 White, 712 Amethyst, 713 Primrose, 706
Tangerine, 707 Evergreen, 710 Sunshine, 761
Perfect Matte Spray, 900 white, 902 Black.

Kimble IT Brush Kit, Detail Brushes, Glaze Brush

Quality paper towels

Apply 3 coats of EL 119 Burnished Steel to the base and lid cone 04 bisque. Fire according to the manufacturers instructions.

Basecoat the entirety of the body piece (the cylinder piece with the butterfly scene) with 750 Bisque Primer. Allow the basecoat to dry completely.

To “marbleize” the background of the scene, apply dime sized blotches of 710 Sapphire and 700 White 2 inches apart all over. Completely saturate a quality paper towel with water. Bunch the wet paper towel into a wad and begin pouncing the towel onto the Sapphire and White blotches repeatedly. The color will begin to blend and lift. Continue pouncing onto the color and turn the towel or remoisten the towel if necessary. Reapply color and continue pouncing until the desired marbleized effect is achieved. Use a clean moist paper towel and Q-tips to remove the color from the flowers , leaves and butterfly. Allow the piece to rest until the background is dry.

Using clean natural hair filbert brushes of appropriate sizes, sparingly apply the following colors to the following areas: Snapdragon – 712 Amethyst, Hibiscus – 713 Primrose, Small flowers – 706 Tangerine, Leaves – 707 Evergreen, Butterfly Wings – 710 Sunshine. Pat back the colors using clean brushes to desired intensity. Pat back the snapdragons with a clean paper towel to highlight. Apply a small amount of 712 Amethyst to center of hibiscus to shade the center. Apply a small amount of 706 Tangerine to the inside portion of the wings to accent. After the color has dried, spray the piece with 761 Perfect Matte Spray. Apply 902 Black to the butterfly body, antennae and outline of the wings. Apply 900 White to the center pieces of the hibiscus and the small flowers.
